ADMISSION AND PROGRESS THROUGH THE SCHOOL

All prospective parents are invited to have a personal tour of the school and to meet the Headmaster prior to registering. Ranby House is non-selective and pupils may enter at any stage, although the natural points of entry are at ages 3, 7 and 11. Children are very welcome to visit the school for taster days as part of the decision-making process.

Once you have decided that Ranby House is the school for your child, please complete the Registration Form which can be found at the back of this information booklet. The Headmaster's PA is the Assistant Registrar and is always available to guide parents through the admissions process.

Pre-Prep (Nursery to Year 2)

The Early Years Foundation Stage (3+)

Children may start at Ranby House School on or after their third birthday.



Morning and/or afternoon sessions start as optional in the Nursery, building to full-time in the Reception class (4+). These first two years provide a caring and stimulating start to more formal learning.

Years 1 and 2 (5+)

Children continue their education within the Pre-Prep. These two years introduce more formal learning including specialist teaching in French, Music, Swimming and PE.

At the end of this stage, the transition to the Prep School is carefully managed.

Prep School (Years 3 to 8)

Years 3 and 4 (7+)

Pupils are now ready for the challenges and excitements of a broader curriculum and they benefit from a longer school day.

Although the children are still based in a caring classroom environment with a form teacher delivering most of the core subjects, they start moving around the school to benefit from specialist teaching in areas such as Drama, Art, Music, Religious Studies, French, PE and Games, and Design Technology.

From September 2011 the Years 3 & 4 teaching week is Monday to Friday.

Years 5 and 6 (9+)

The school week extends to include a Saturday morning of lessons. (From September 2012 the teaching week will be from Monday to Friday throughout the school). Pupils gain more independence and responsibility as they move around the school to different areas for specific subjects.

A Form Teacher provides the central figure in the care and supervision of each child. More formal homework is introduced at this stage.

Years 7 and 8 (11+)

Whether at Ranby House for these two years alone or for their final two years at the school, each and every Ranbian is prepared thoroughly for the expectations of life at senior school. Most pupils transfer at 13+ to our senior school, Worksop College.

Pupils are prepared for their transfer examinations to senior school at 13+ or for academic scholarship. Pupils are provided with the opportunity to enjoy a wide range of success and to develop their leadership and other talents for the future.



CURRICULUM AND AWARD WINNERS

Our curriculum is broad. All children study the traditional academic subjects; however in addition Art, Music, Design Technology, ICT, Personal, Social and Health Education, Sports and Physical Education are also part of the curriculum. All our pupils benefit from small classes and the individual attention of the teachers.

As children progress through the Prep School, their classes are set or streamed by ability to provide for the differing needs of individuals. The work of the pupils is extended and celebrated through a number of events each academic year. Our annual Book Week celebrates literature through visiting authors, poets and educational groups to explore the themes which recently have included 'Chinese New Year', 'The Tudors', 'Diamonds are Forever' and 'Down to the Sea'.



The end-of-year Art and Design Technology Exhibition is a showcase for the creativity of our pupils, each one exhibiting a piece of their work from both subject areas. World Maths Day is marked each year through competitions, challenges and events.

Learning Support

Individual needs are also met by our Learning Support Department which provides extra one-to-one or small group session work with pupils both in and outside the classroom. Guidance is also given to the staff to ensure that pupils of all abilities have a chance to realise their potential.

All pupils are screened on their entry to the Prep School to determine what level of support, if any, is required and this is then discussed with parents. The work of the Learning Support Department is seen as integral to the life of the school and all staff are sympathetic to the individual needs of each child.

Gifted and Talented

The most able pupils at Ranby House are stretched and challenged through their academic teaching and also through the breadth of opportunity on offer to extend and to complement the curriculum.

In Year 8 a number of pupils are prepared for Senior School Scholarship transfer examinations.

Those who excel in areas such as Music, Art, Sport and Drama are also provided with opportunities to develop their skills and talents, including the possibility of gaining a scholarship award to their chosen senior school.

SPORT

Ranby House has a well deserved reputation for sporting excellence. All pupils are encouraged to be involved in team sports. Pupils in the Prep School can choose to play sport every day, especially if they include a Thursday afternoon sports activity.

Major sports are rugby, hockey, football, cricket and athletics for boys and hockey, netball, rounders and athletics for girls. Both boys and girls compete in cross country running and pupils in Years 1 to 4 have weekly swimming lessons at Retford Leisure Centre.

There are weekly PE lessons and, as the children's ability and skills grow, opportunities are provided to learn and play sports such as Basketball, Tennis, Volleyball, Orienteering, Badminton as well as Gymnastics and fitness training.

The confidence of those who do not necessarily enjoy team sports as much as others is boosted through an Enrichment Programme of activities and experiences designed to teach pupils a variety of skills including leadership, problem solving, campcraft and first aid.

At Ranby House our multifunctional, vibrant and lively Performing Arts Centre is the venue for a full calendar of musical, drama and other events throughout the academic year. MUSIC

Music is a major part of school life at Ranby House. All pupils have class music lessons, with pupils in Year 2 learning the recorder and Year 3 pupils learning to play the violin. In addition a team of visiting music teachers provide instruction on a wide variety of instruments through individual music lessons for pupils in Years 3 and above, leading to a series of informal and formal concerts as well as Music Festivals and Competitions.

Careful timetabling of individual music lessons ensures that pupils do not miss the same academic lesson each week.

Once pupils have reached the appropriate level in their individual playing, they are encouraged to join with others to make music in a number of groups and ensembles.

As well as the School Orchestra, pupils may join groups such as Chapel Choir, Girls' Chamber Choir, Boys' Choir, Clarinet Group, Flute Group, Junior Guitar Group, Senior Guitar Group, Jazz Band, Samba Band, Saxophone Group, String Ensemble, Senior Vocal Ensemble and Woodwind Group.

Two major concerts (at Christmas and in the Summer) provide the opportunity for the Orchestra, groups and ensembles to perform to an audience.

Individuals have the opportunity to gain confidence by performing to smaller audiences at the informal concerts programmed throughout the year.

An Individual Music Festival in the Spring Term culminates in an impressive set of finals after preliminary rounds which allow every musician to be involved at whatever level they have reached.

Children are encouraged in their interest of music and their desire to learn instruments through a number of initiatives. These include a Junk Drumming Workshop, a Brass Workshop and Evening Concert and a Celebration of Song Day involving Ranby House pupils and those from our local primary schools.

As well as leading our singing in the School Chapel, the Choir also attends Choral Days at Worksop College and has been invited to local church services.

Pupils are also entered into the Worksop Music and Drama Festival which takes place in the Spring Term. In 2011 22 Ranbians came in the first three places in their respective classes, 12 in first place.

Music Examinations

Pupils are prepared for Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music and Rock School individual grade examinations.

- Over 100 pupils have been successful in their individual music examinations over the past academic year, including 34 who achieved Merits and 30 who achieved Distinctions. These results include 6 successful Grade 5 candidates.
- Over the past three years, well over 300 individual music exams at Grades 1 to 6 have been taken by Ranbians, resulting in a high number of Merits and Distinctions including 10 pupils who achieved Distinction at Grade 5 and 5 pupils who achieved Merit at Grade 6.

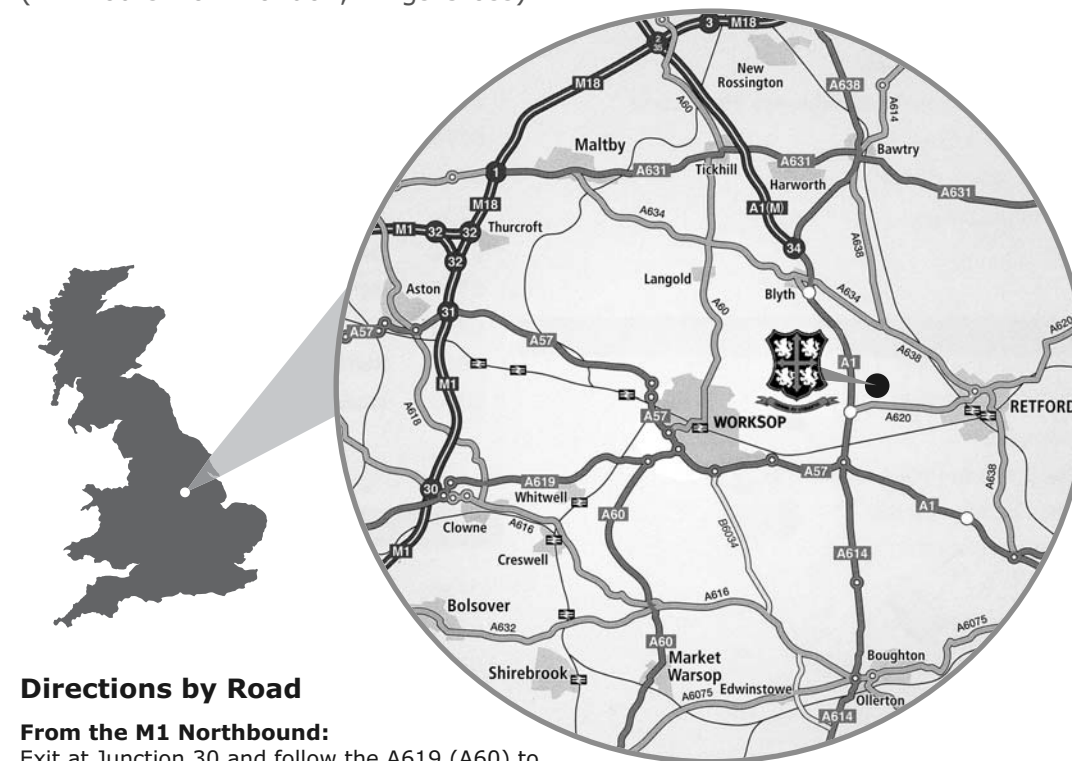

The school is well-situated for road, rail and airport travel: just off the A1, and not far from the M1. There are also fast rail links to Retford railway station on the East Coast Main Line (1½ hours from London, Kings Cross).



Directions by Road

Exit at Junction 30 and follow the A619 (A60) to Worksop and then the A57 to join the A1 northbound towards Doncaster. Then follow directions below for A1 Northbound.

Exit at Junction 31 and follow the A57 to Worksop and onwards to join the A1 northbound towards Doncaster. Then follow directions below for A1 Northbound.

From the A1 Northbound:

Leave the A1 at the A620 Retford and Ranby exit. Turn left on to the A620 towards Retford; the entrance to the school is on the left hand side of the A620 after about a mile.

From the A1 Southbound:

Leave the A1 at the A620 Ranby and Retford exit. Turn right on to the A620 towards Retford; the entrance to the school is on the left hand side of the A620 after about a mile.

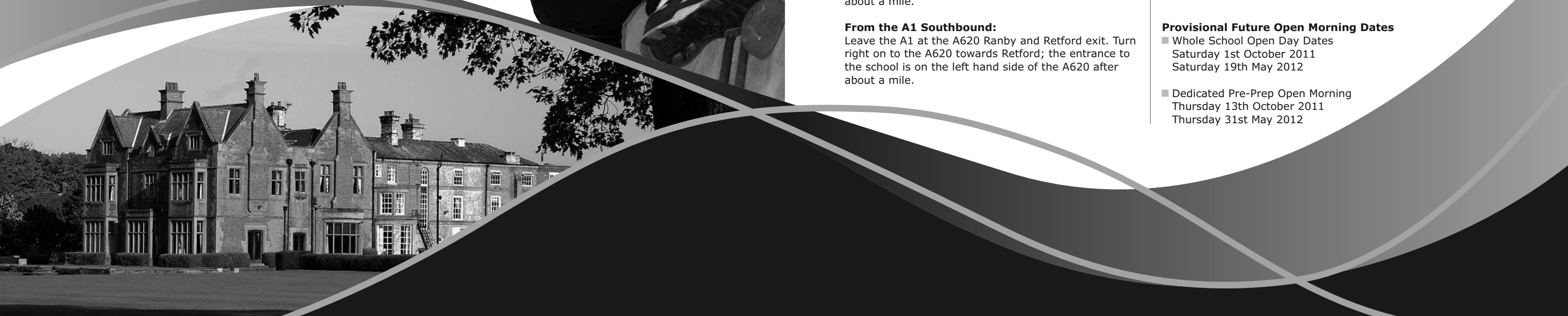
Bus Service
